

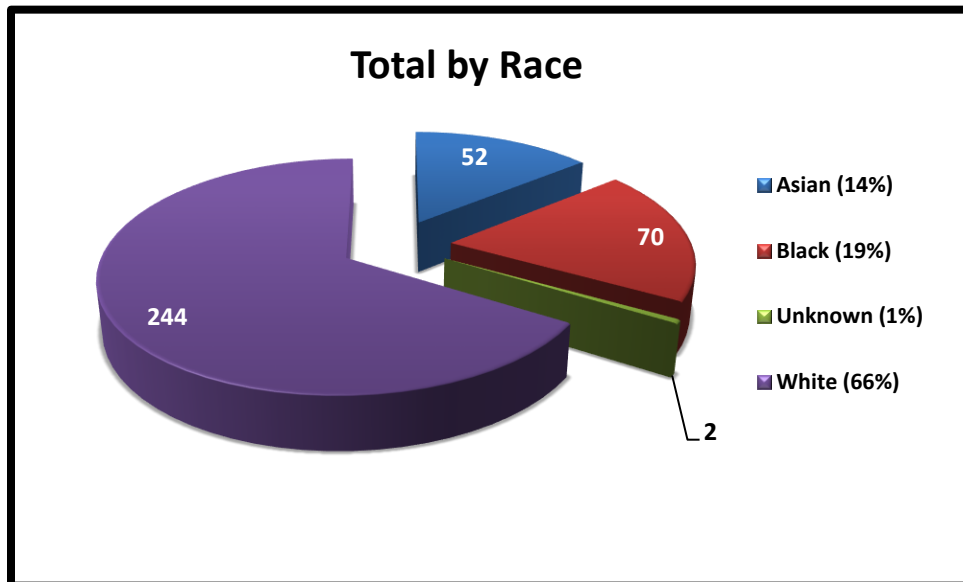

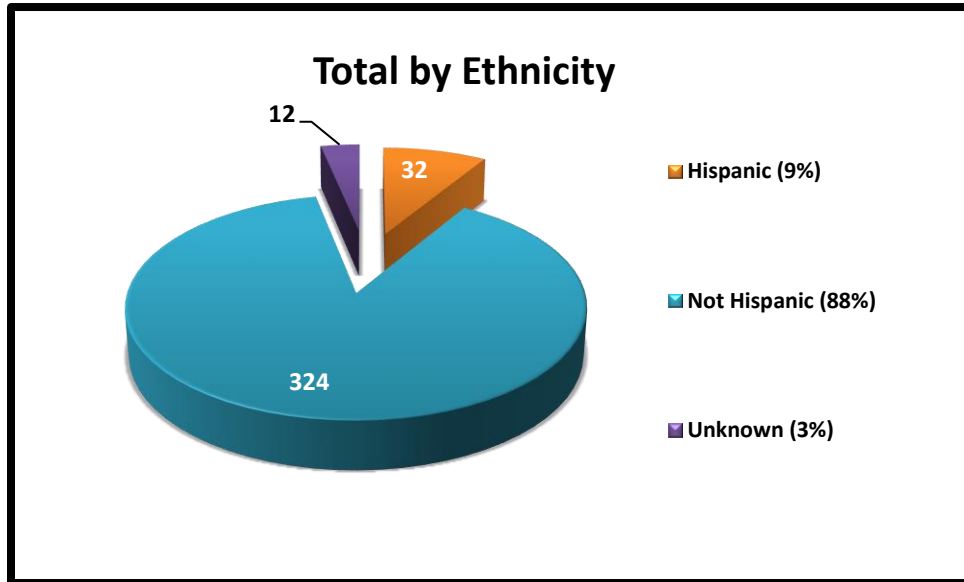

There were a total of 368 traffic stops from Jan. 1, 2023 – Mar. 31, 2023.

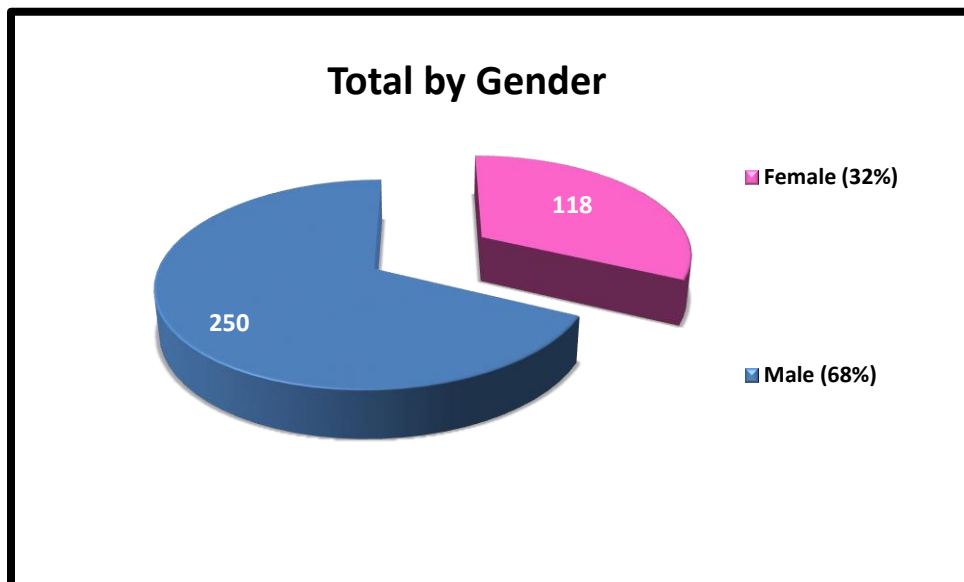

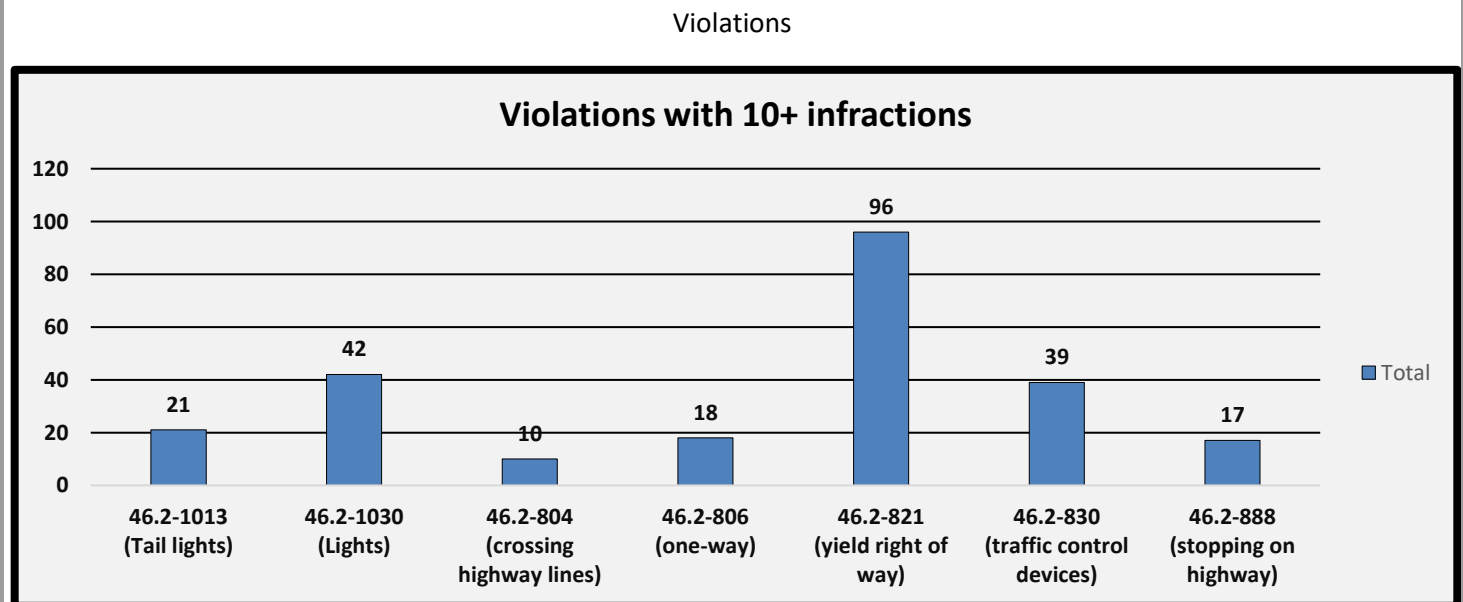
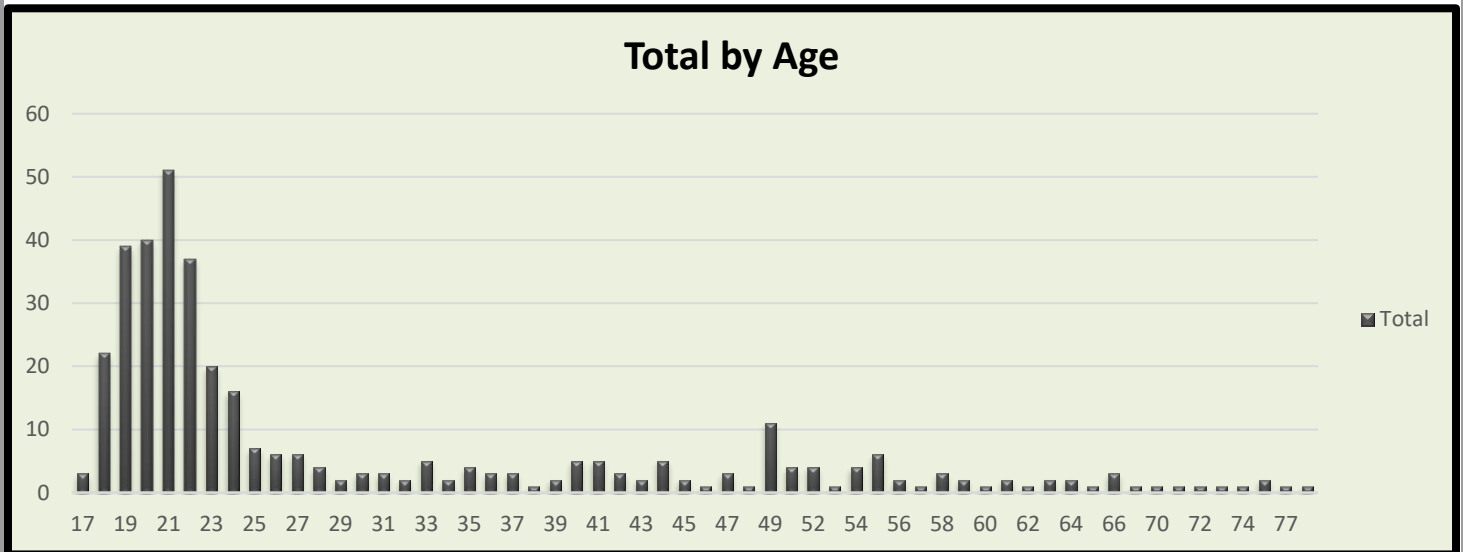
Of the 368 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the ethnicity of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.



Of the 368 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the gender of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.

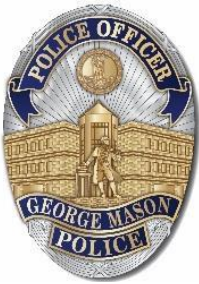


Of the 368 traffic stops, the following graph depicts the age of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.

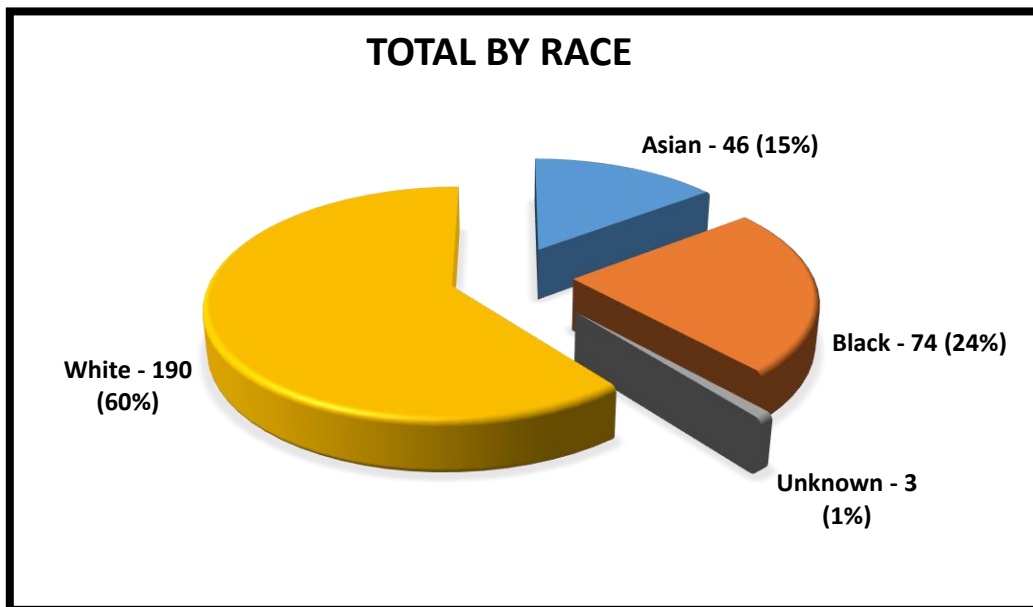

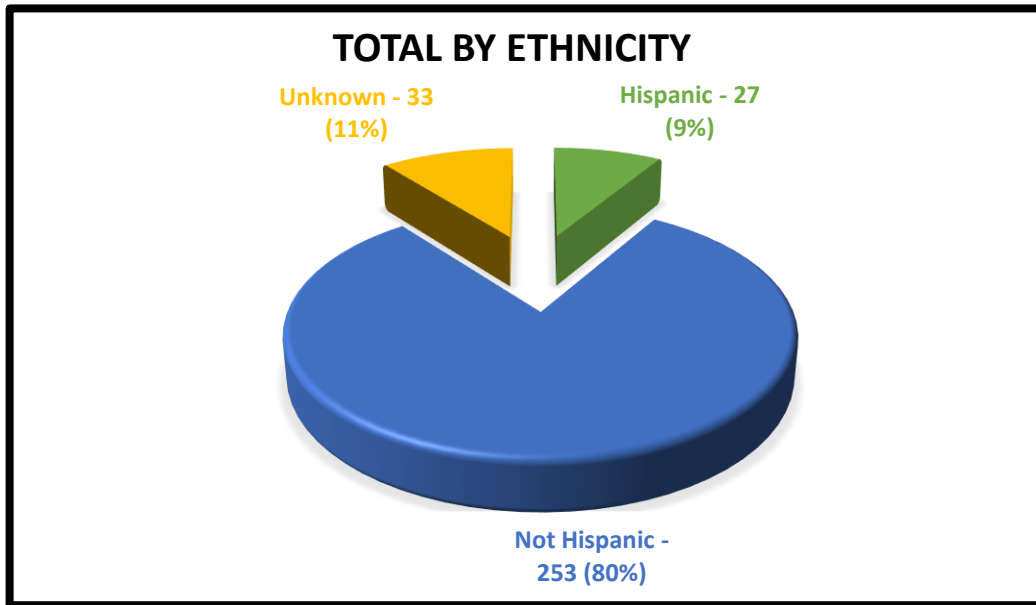

There were a total of 313 traffic stops from April 1, 2023 – June 30, 2023.

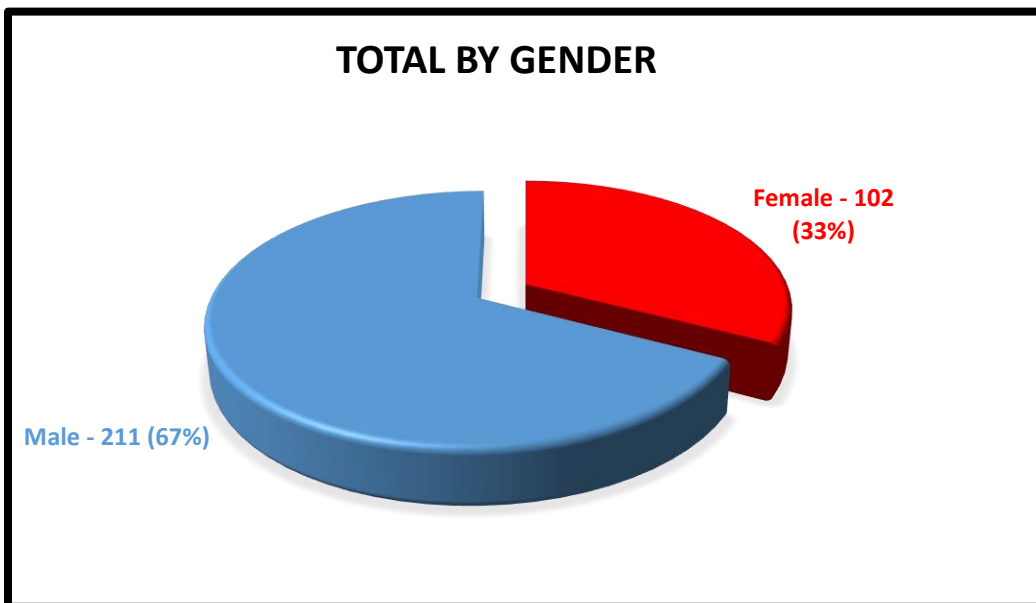

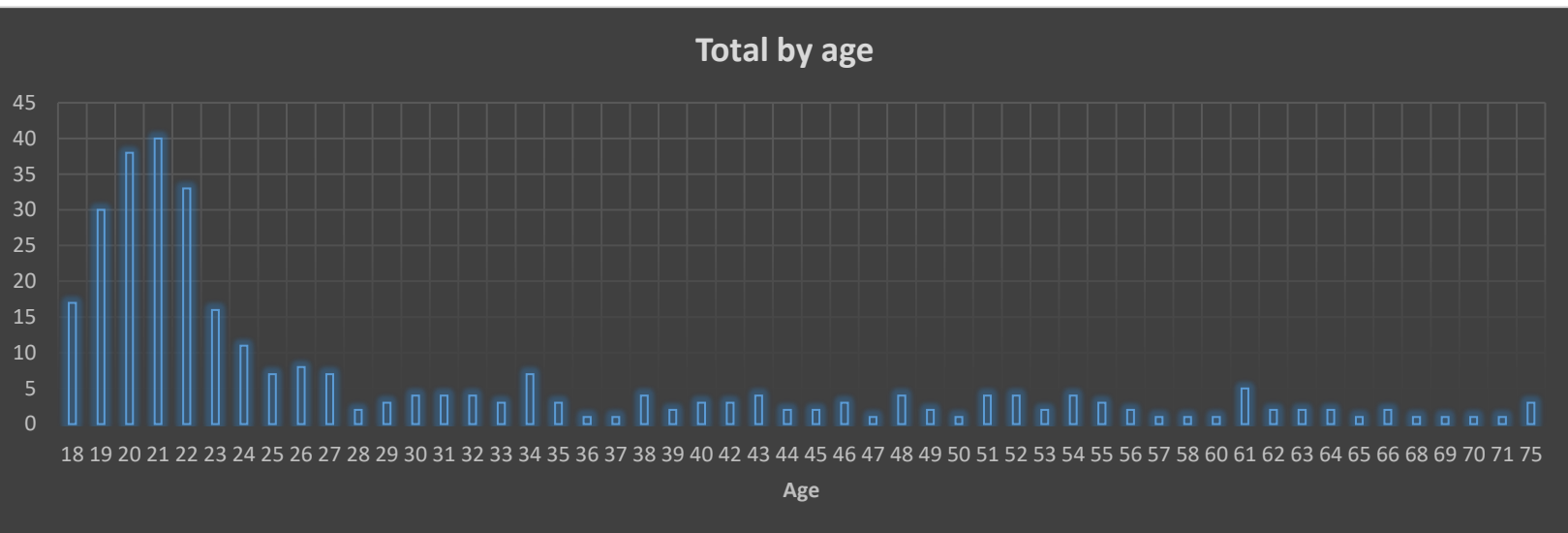
Of the 313 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the ethnicity of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.



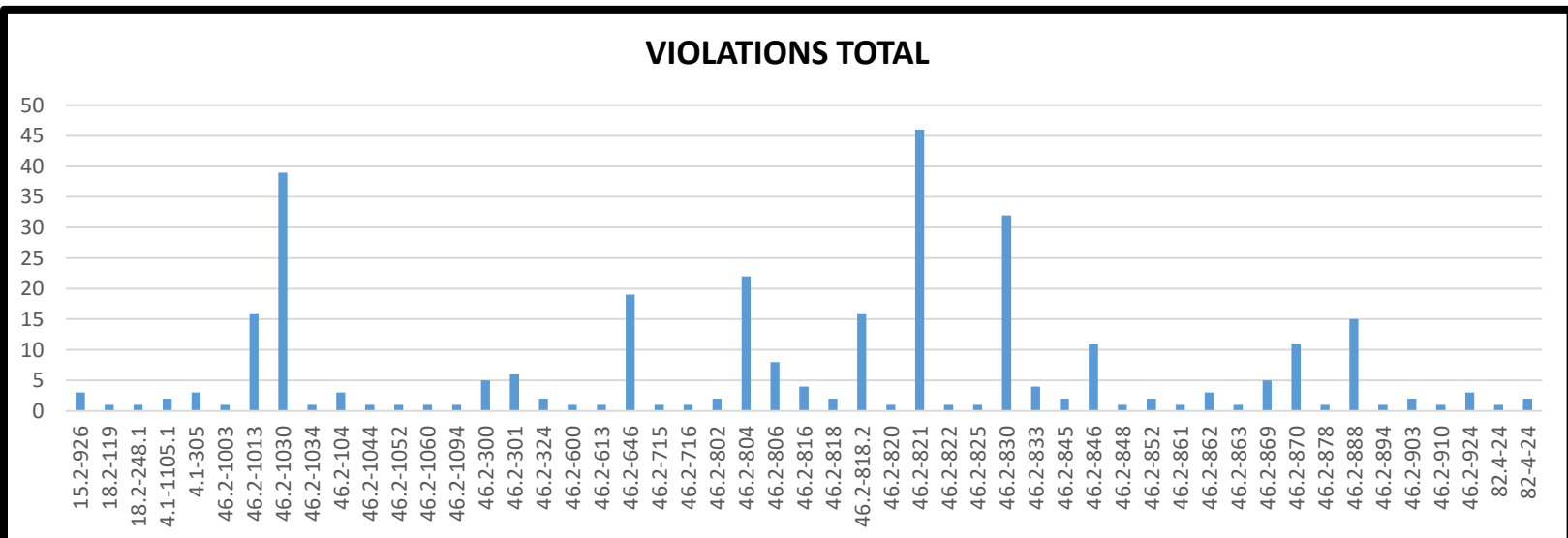
Of the 313 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the gender of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.



Of the 313 traffic stops, the following graph depicts the age of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.

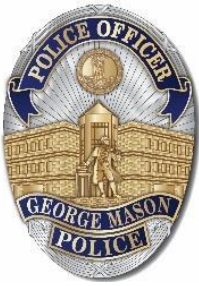


Of the 313 traffic stops, the following graph depicts the number of specific violations.

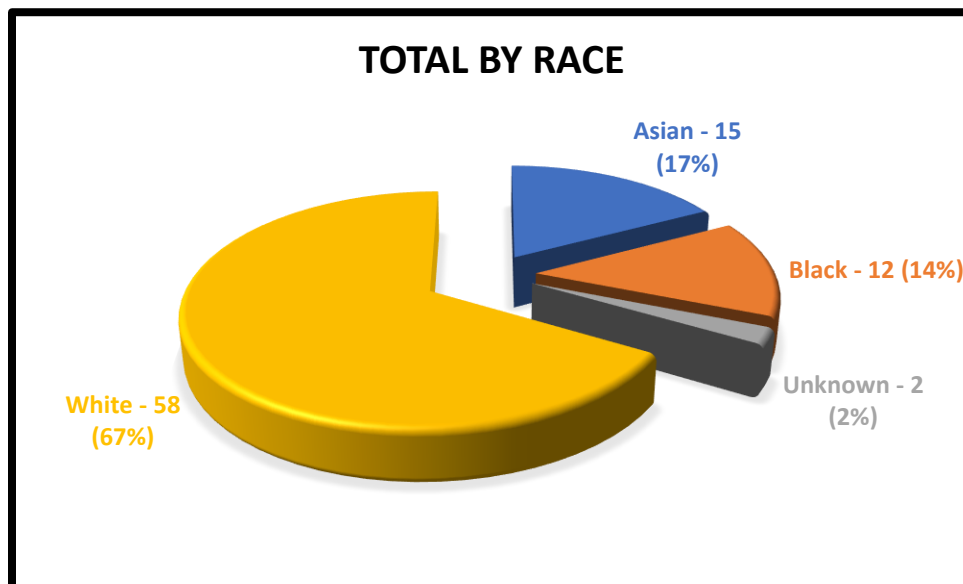

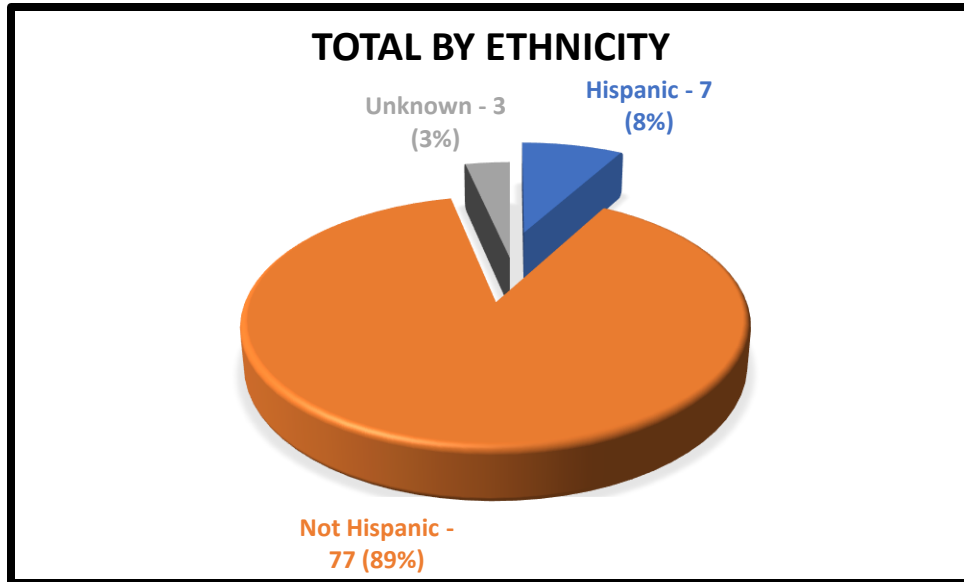

There were a total of 87 traffic stops from July 1 – July 31, 2023.

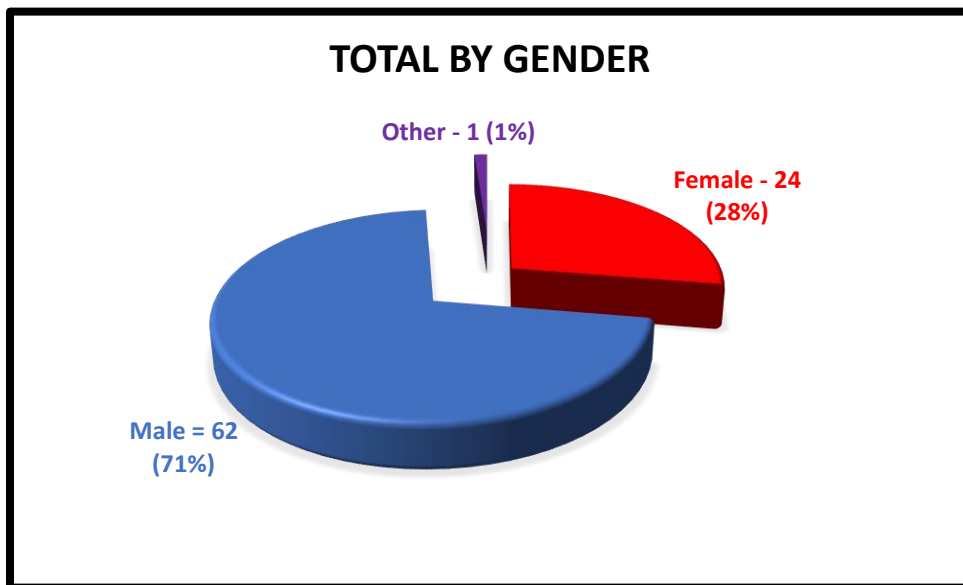

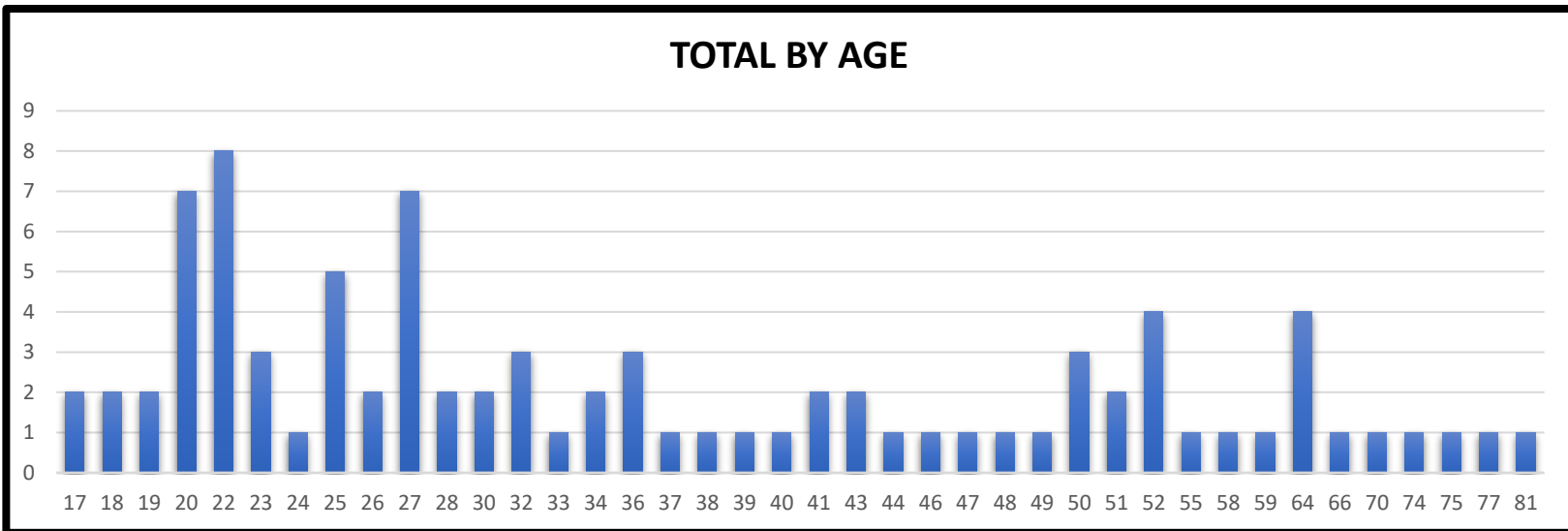

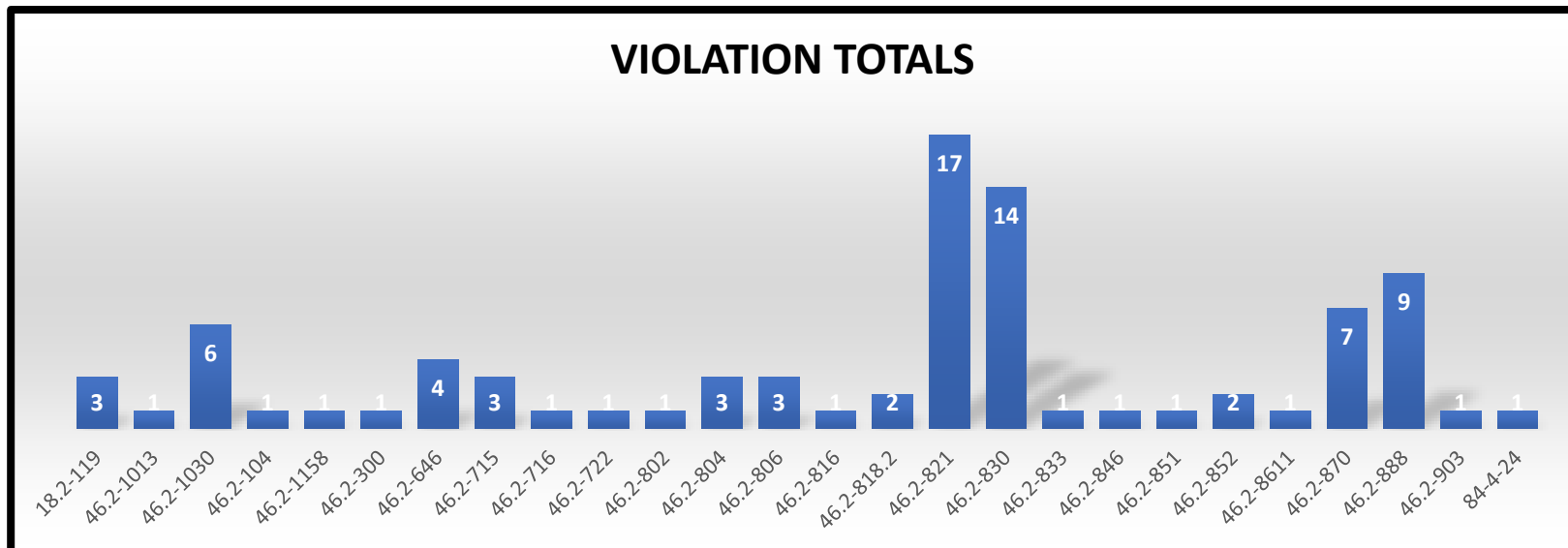

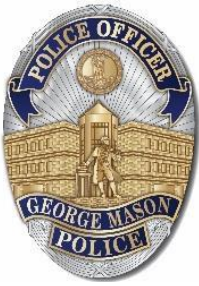

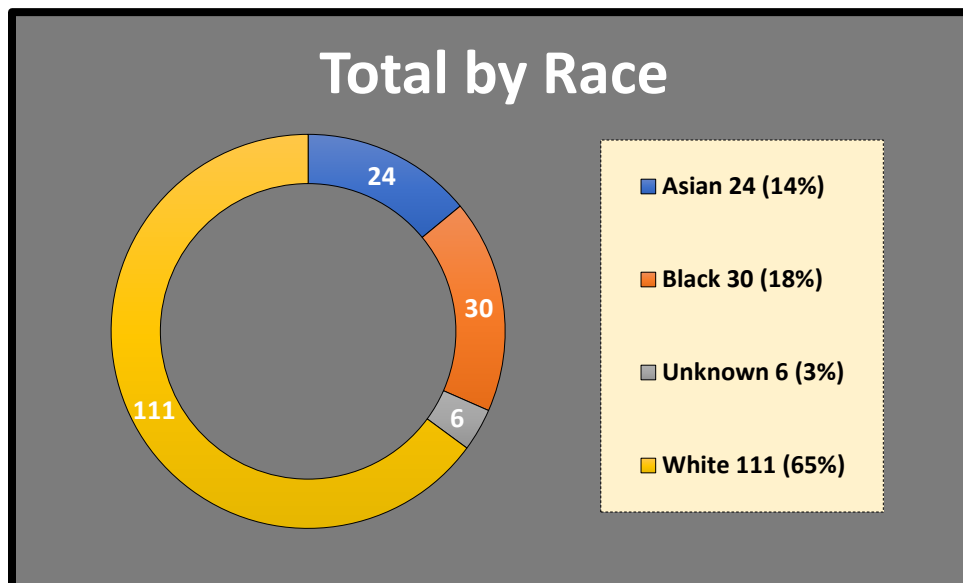

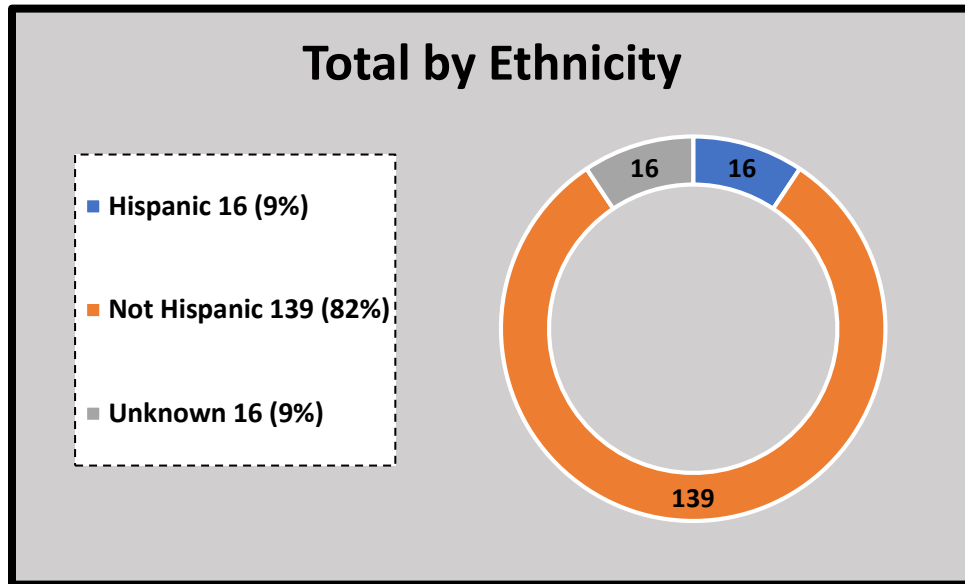

There were a total of 171 traffic stops from Aug. 1 – Aug. 31, 2023.

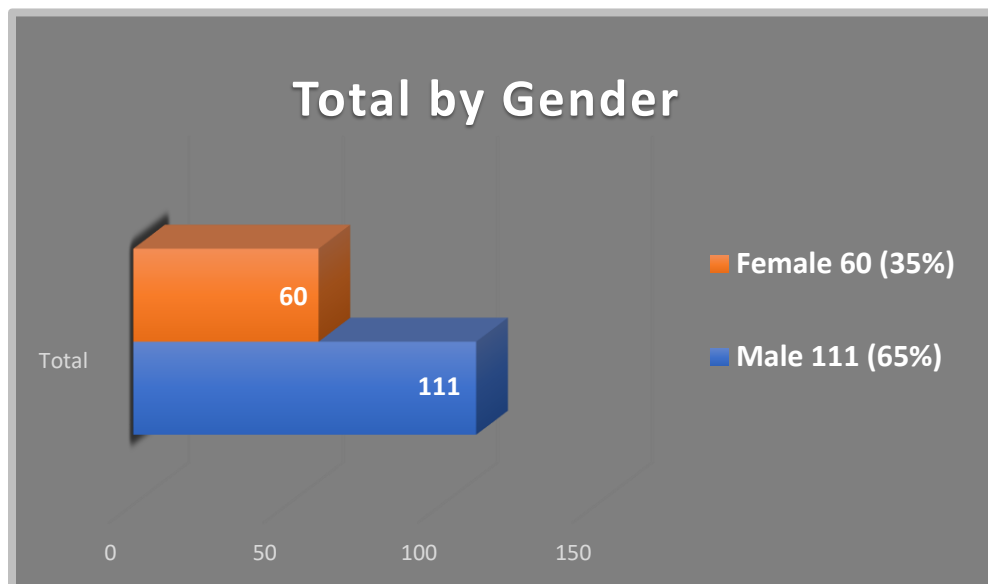

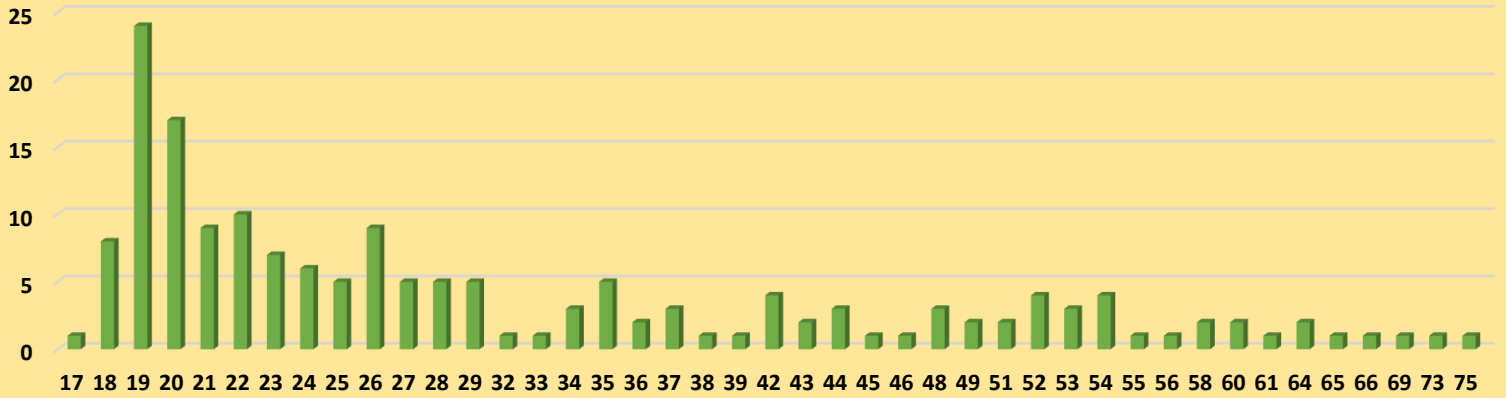


Of the 171 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the gender of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.



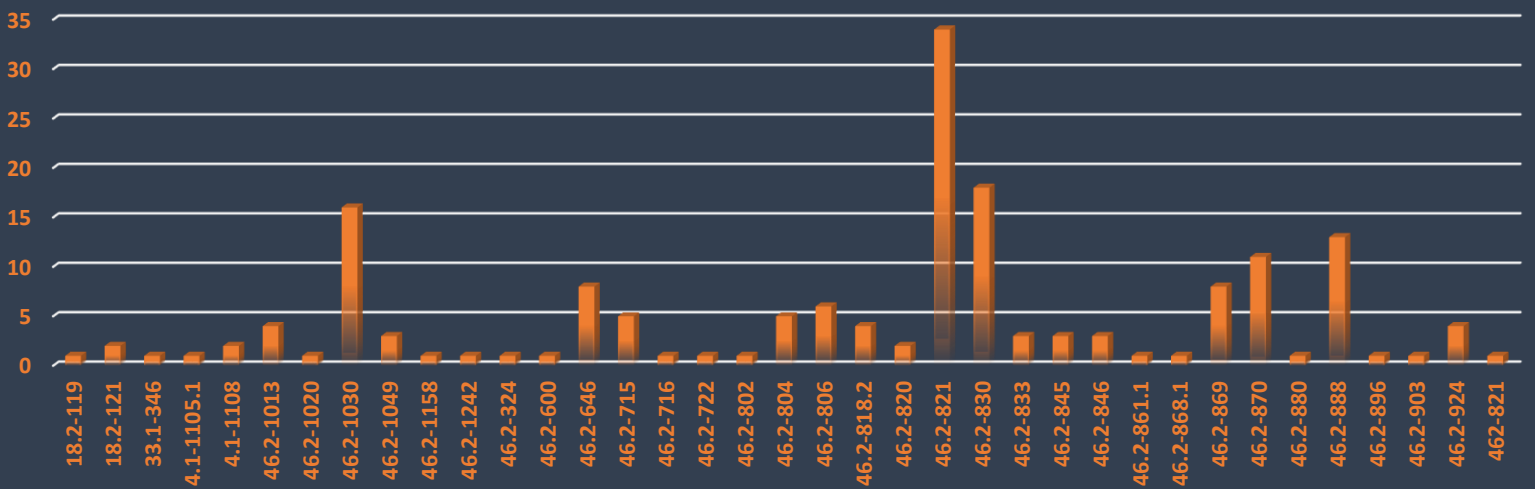

Total by Age



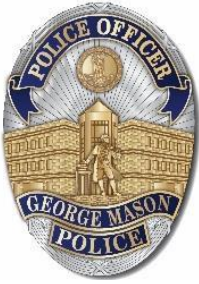

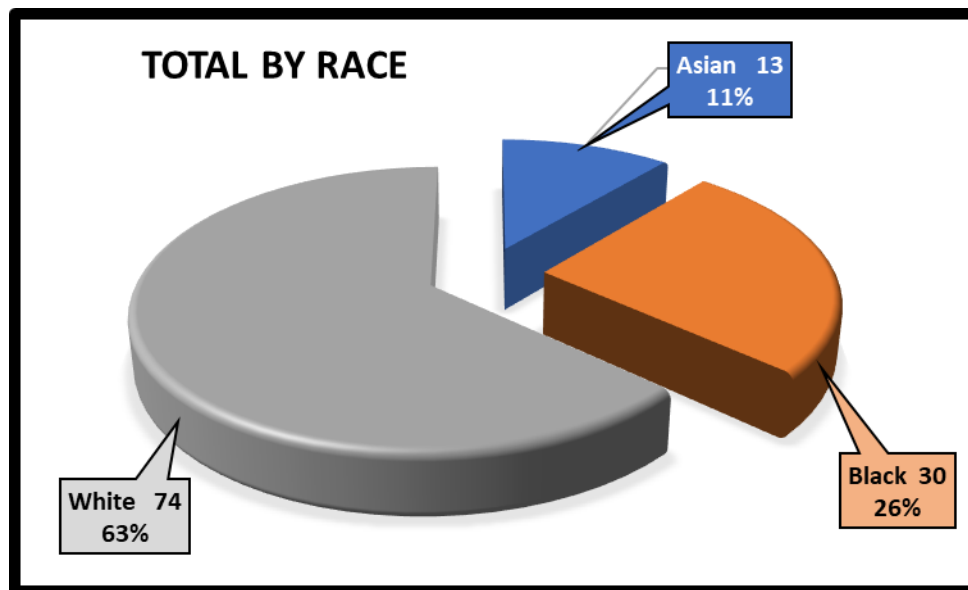

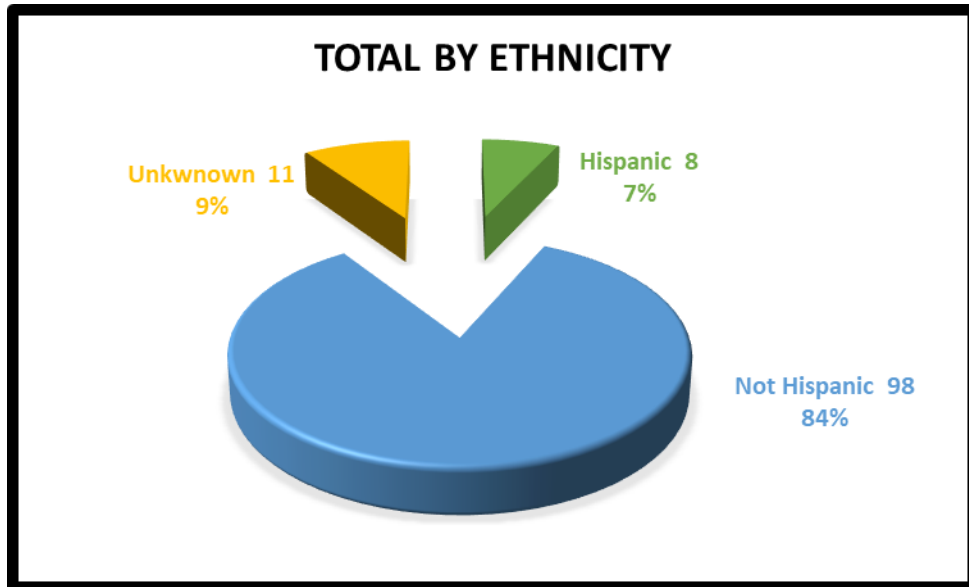

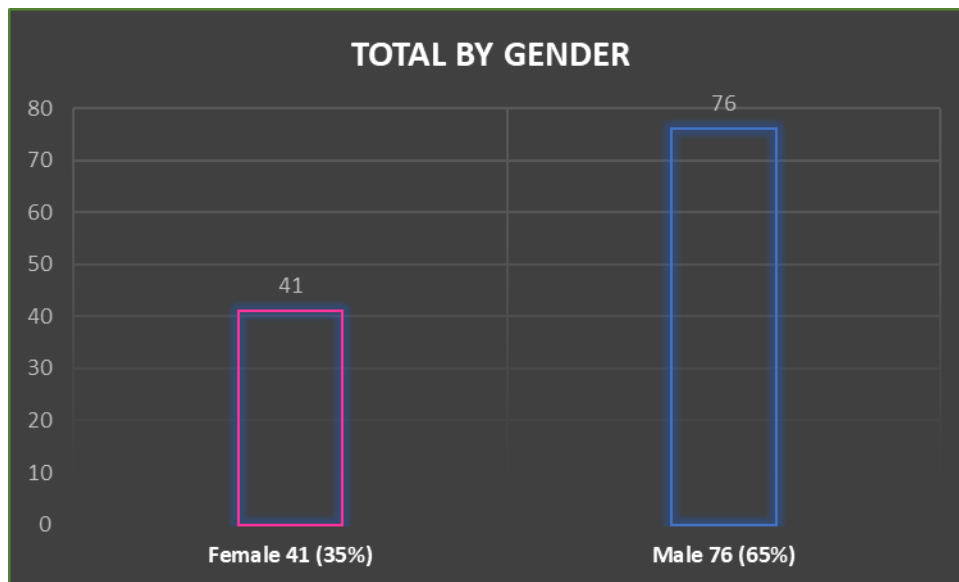

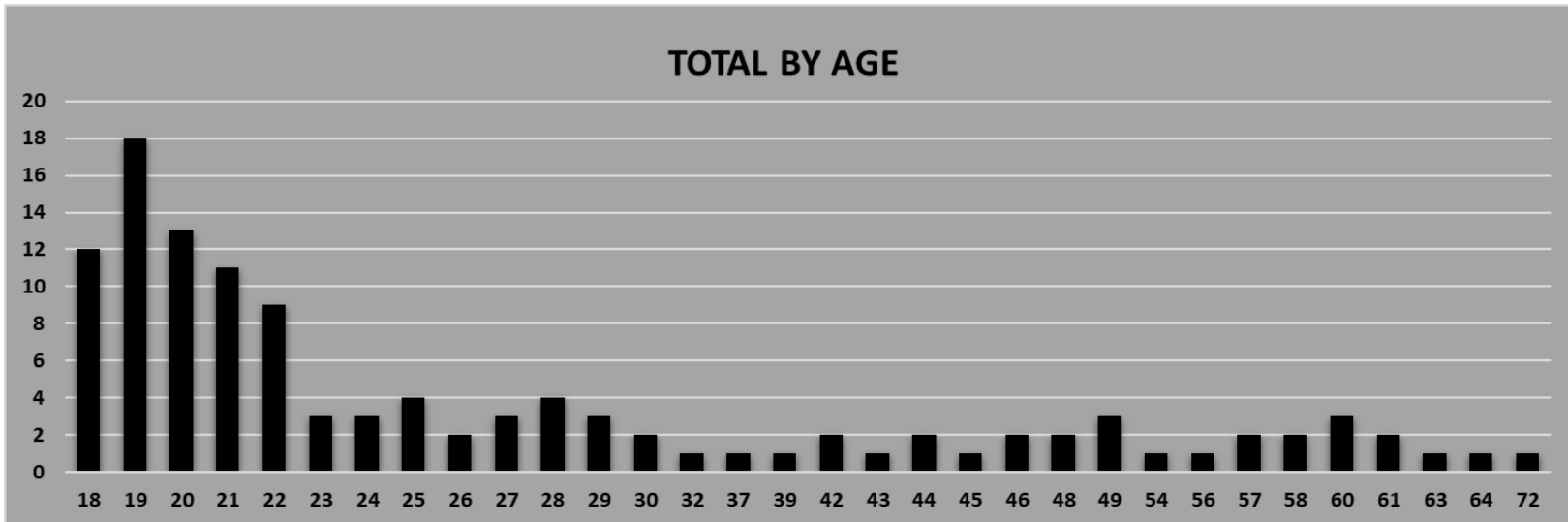
Of the 117 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the ethnicity of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.



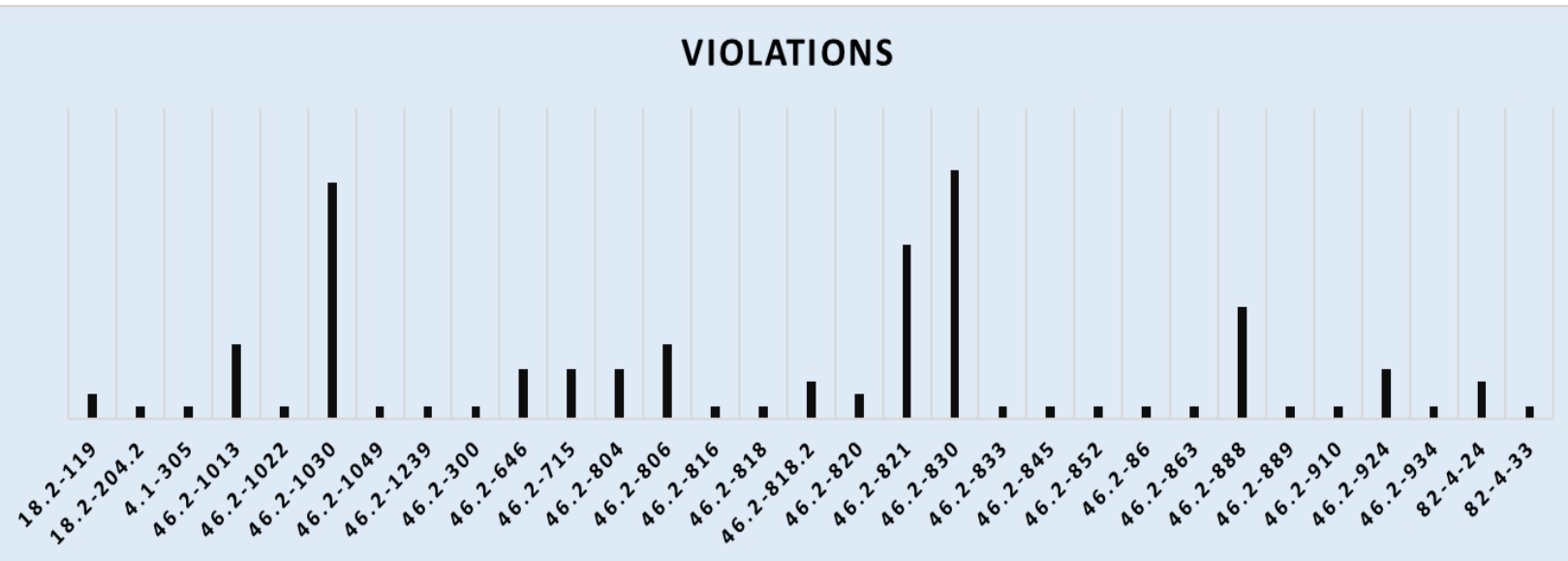
Of the 117 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the gender of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.

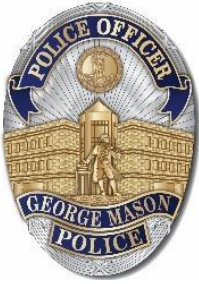

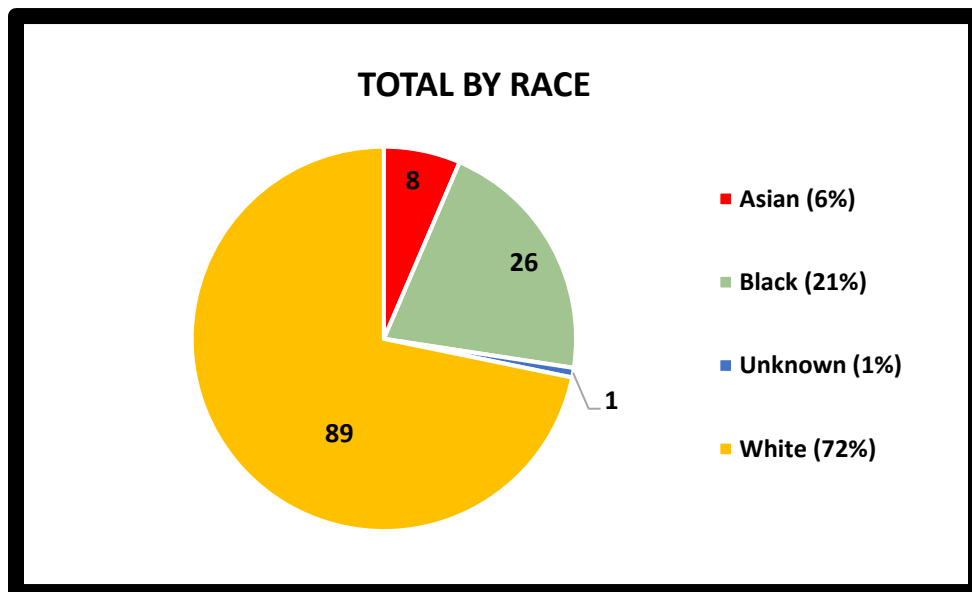

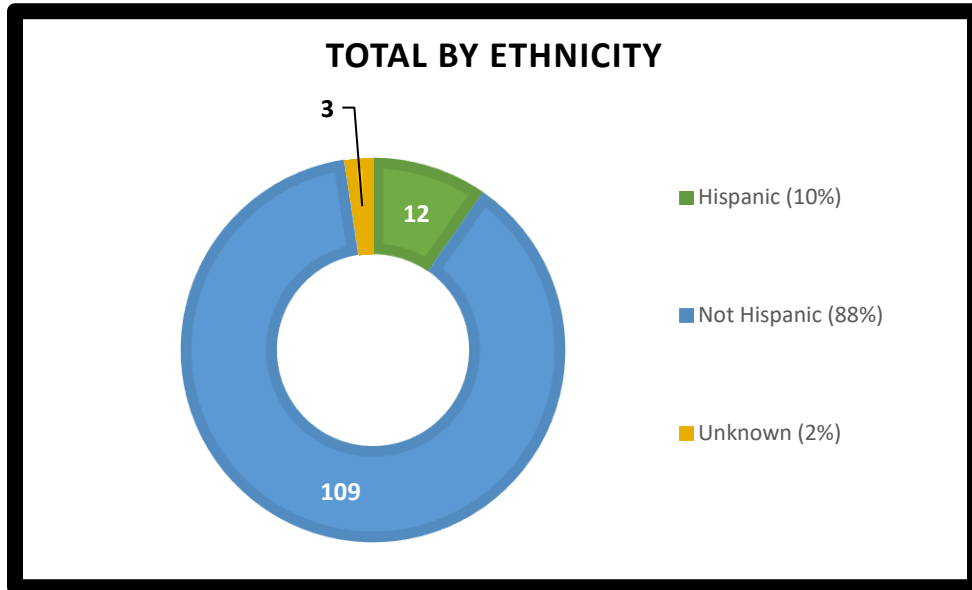

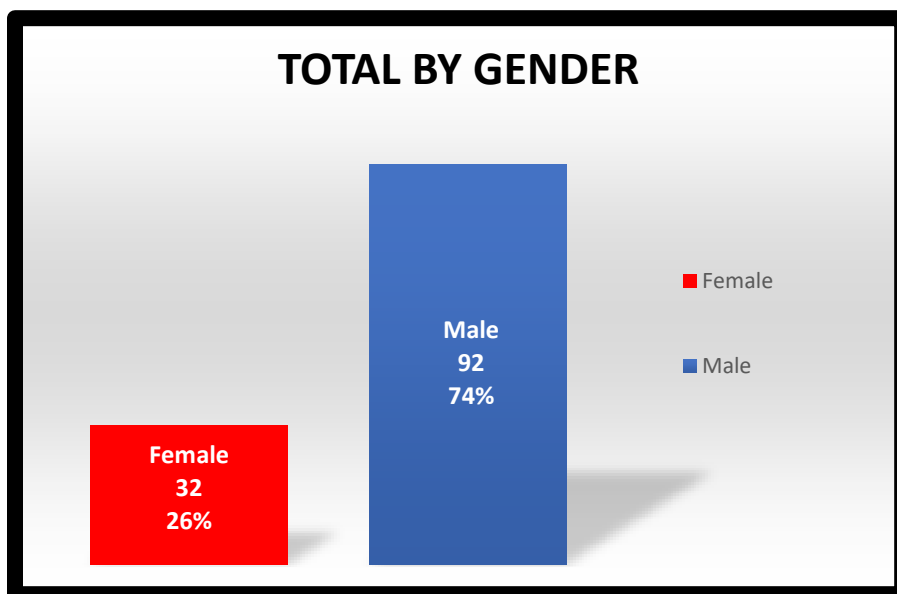

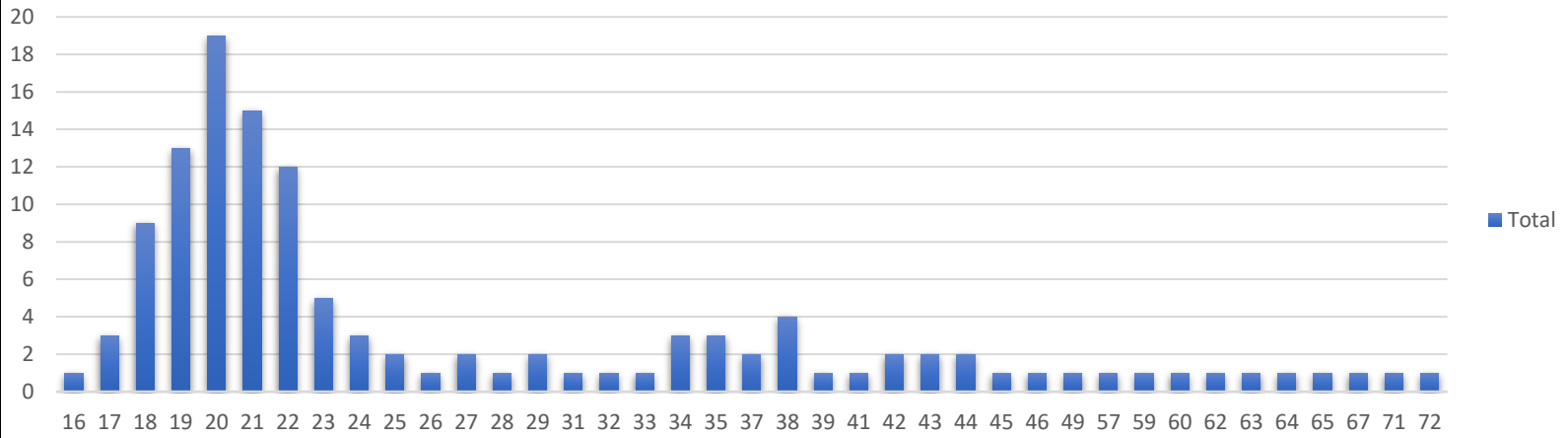


Of the 124 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the gender of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.



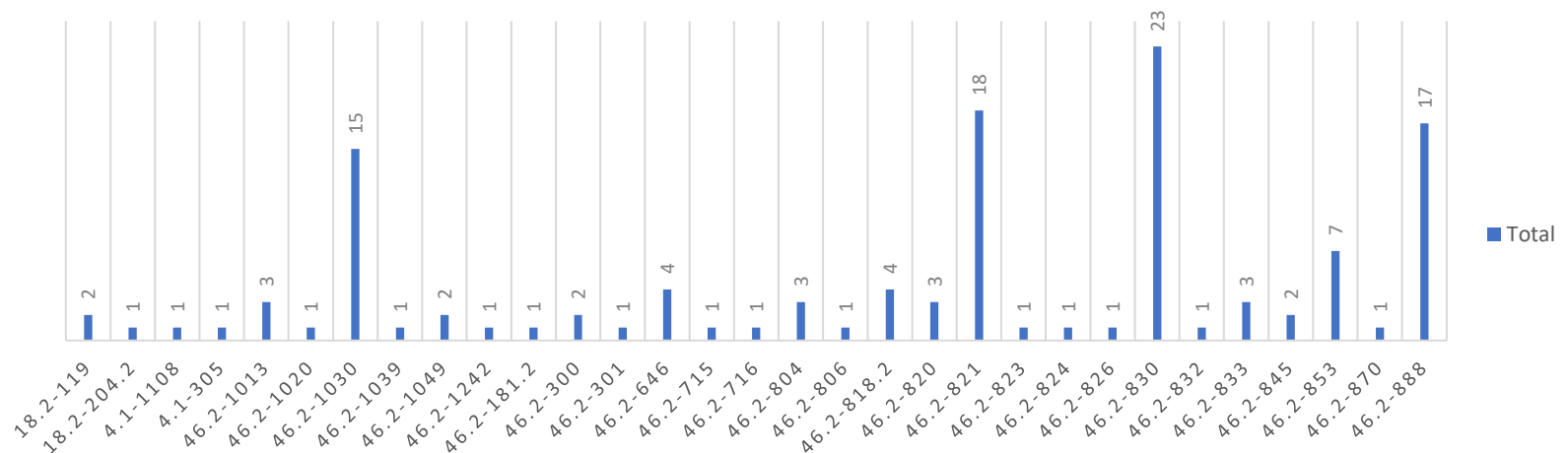
Of the 124 traffic stops, the following graph depicts the age of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.

TOTAL BY AGE



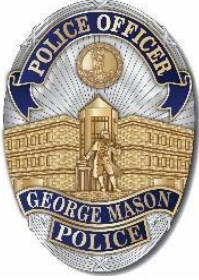

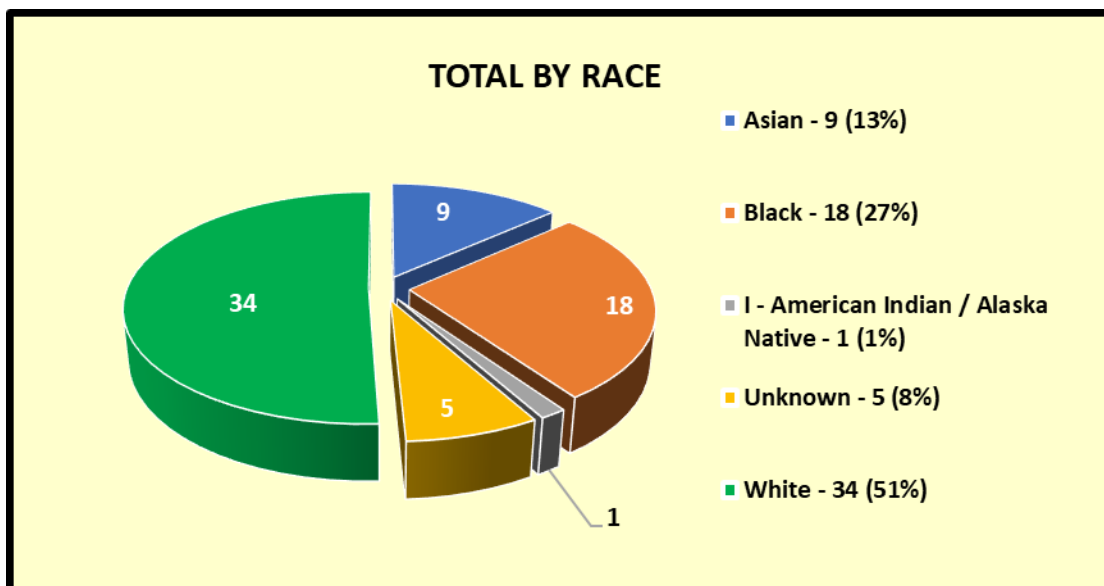

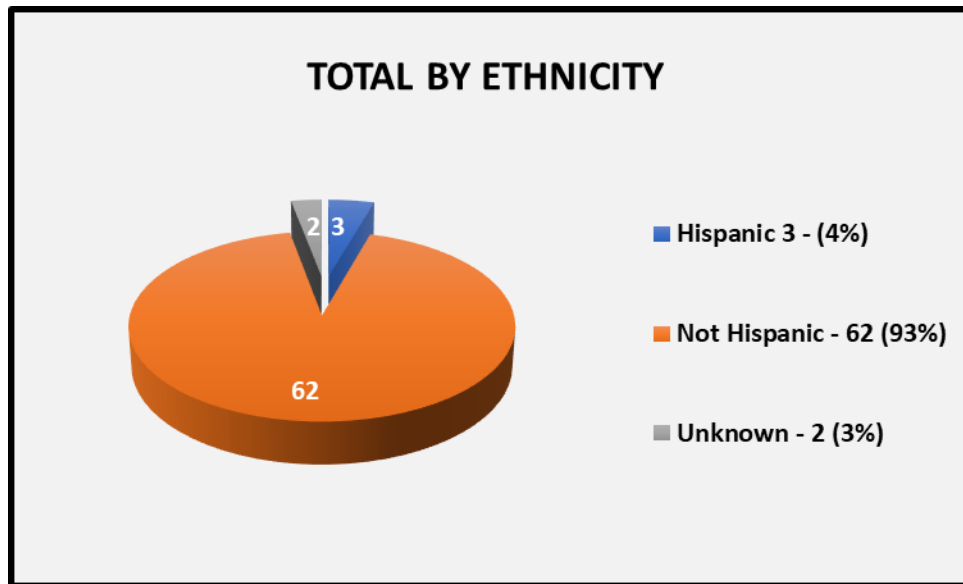

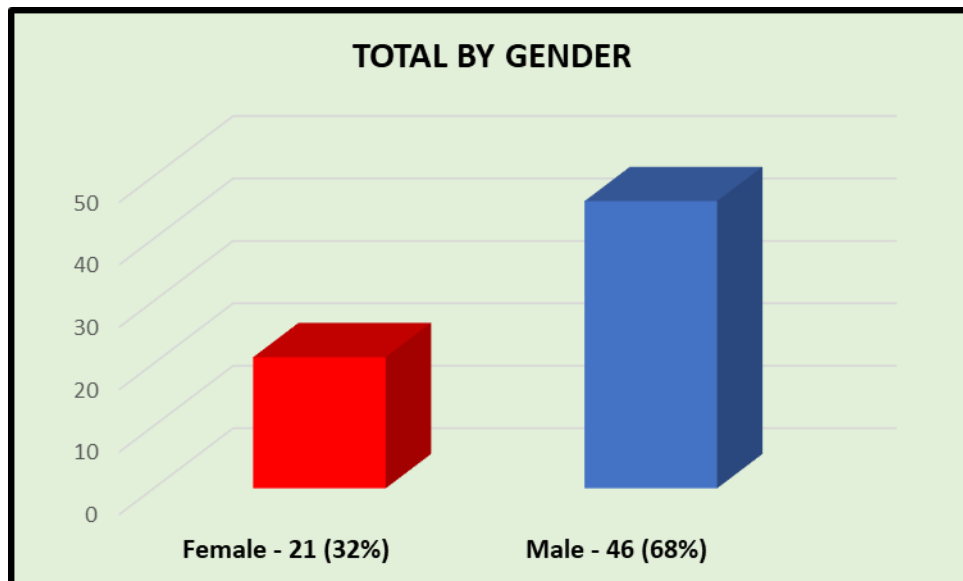

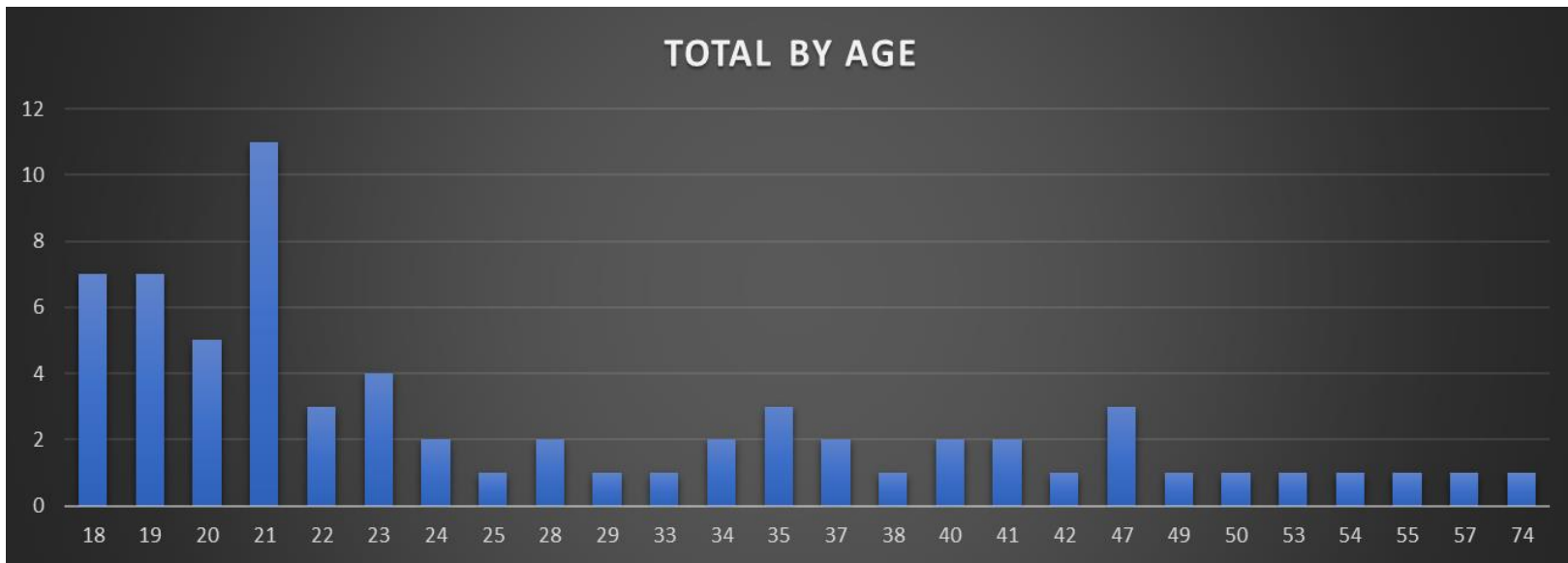
Of the 67 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the ethnicity of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.



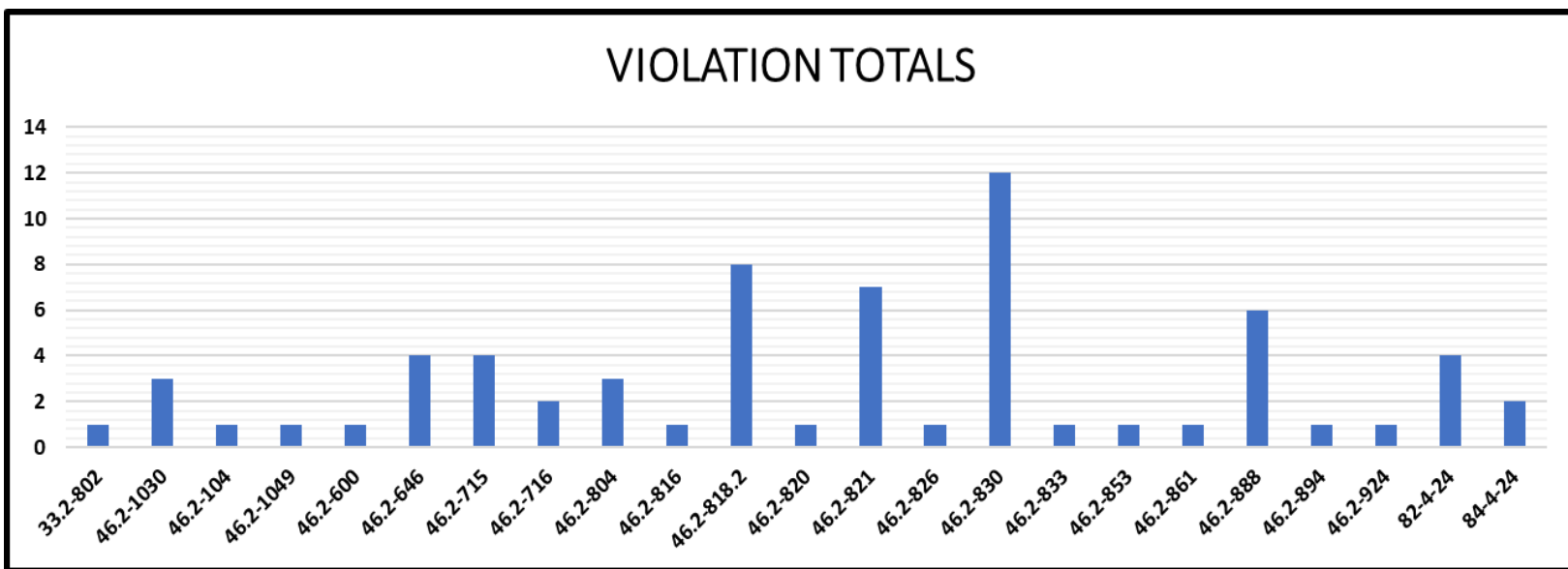
Of the 67 traffic stops, the following chart depicts the gender of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.



Of the 67 traffic stops, the following graph depicts the age of drivers upon officers initiating a traffic stop and making contact.

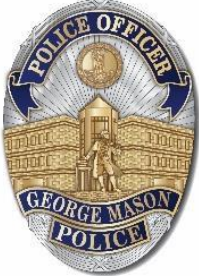

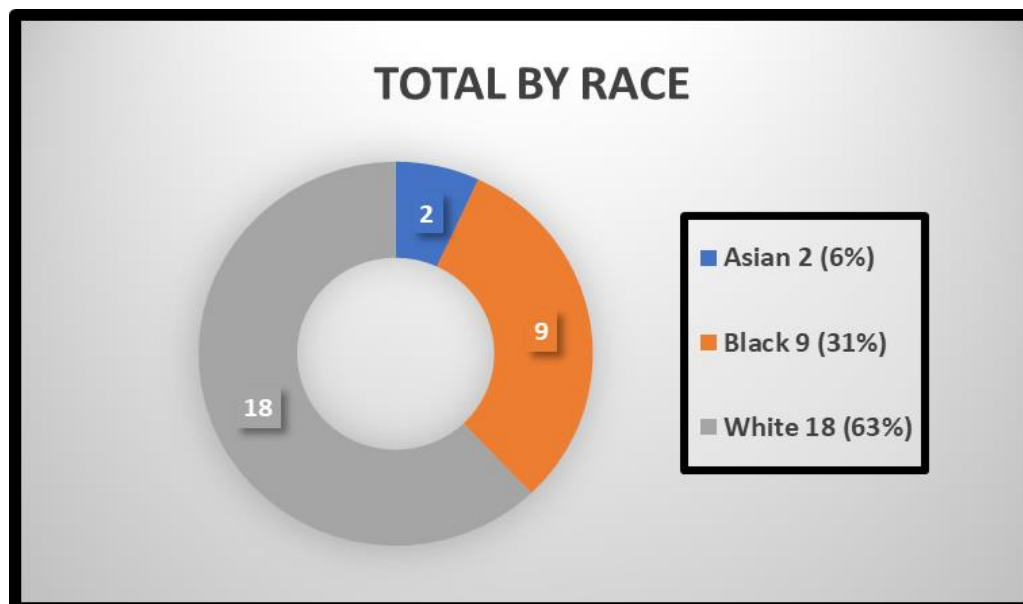

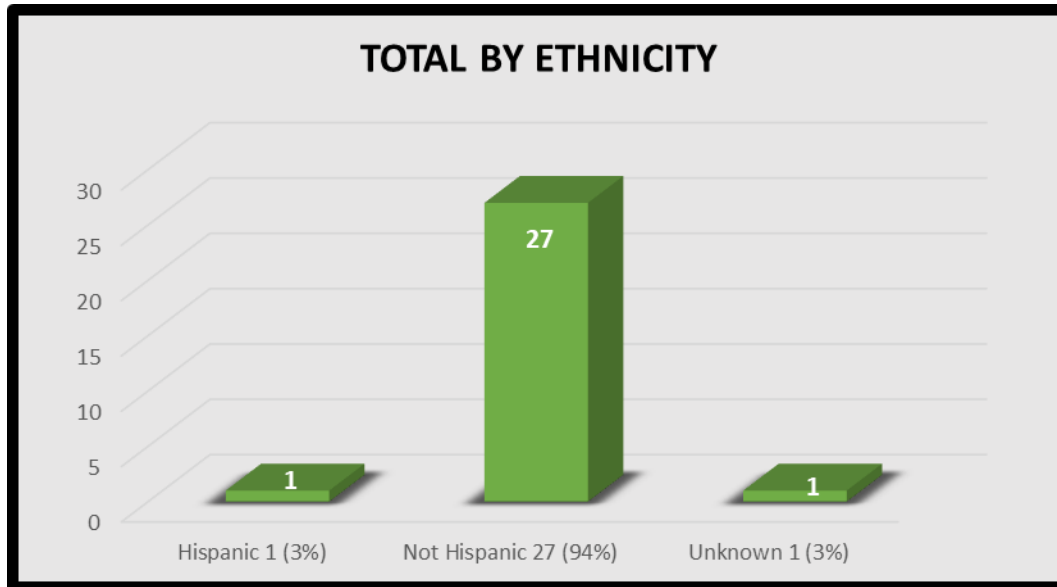

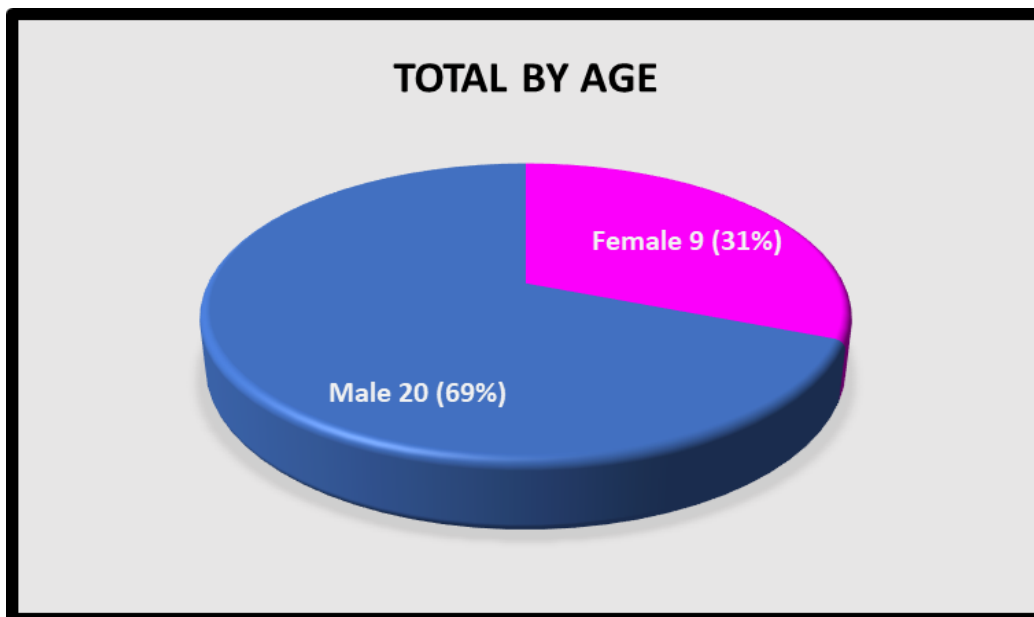

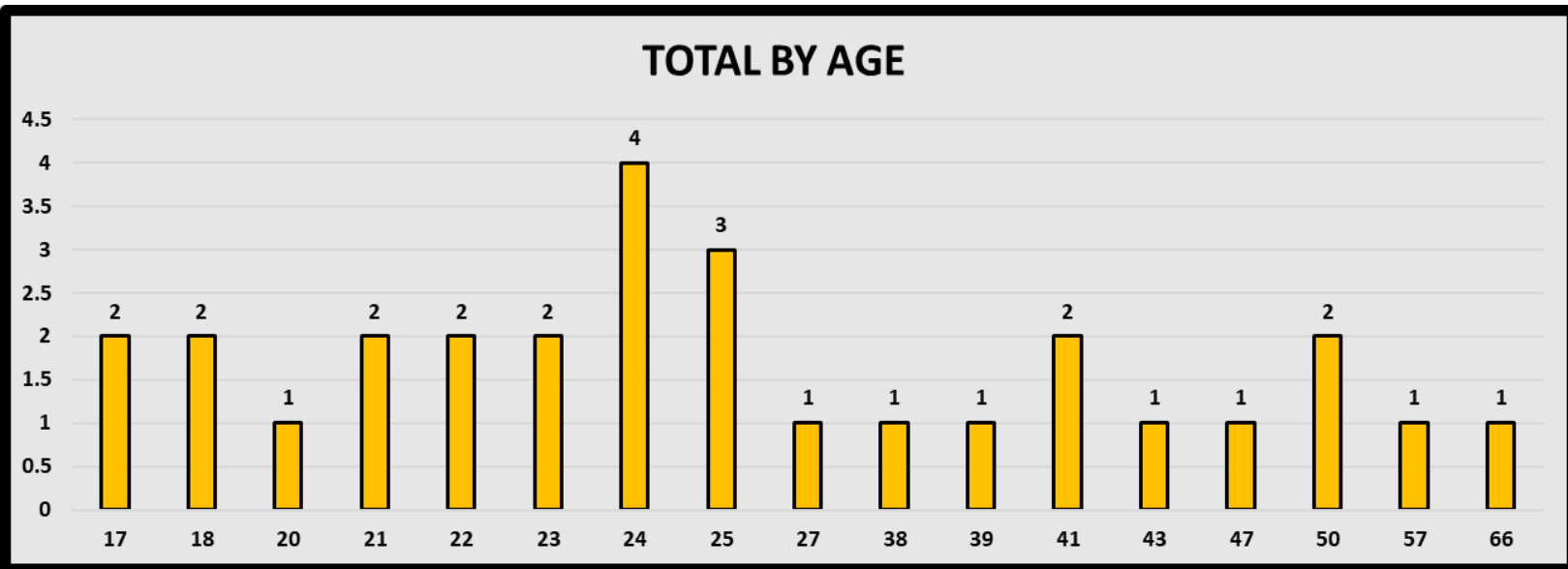

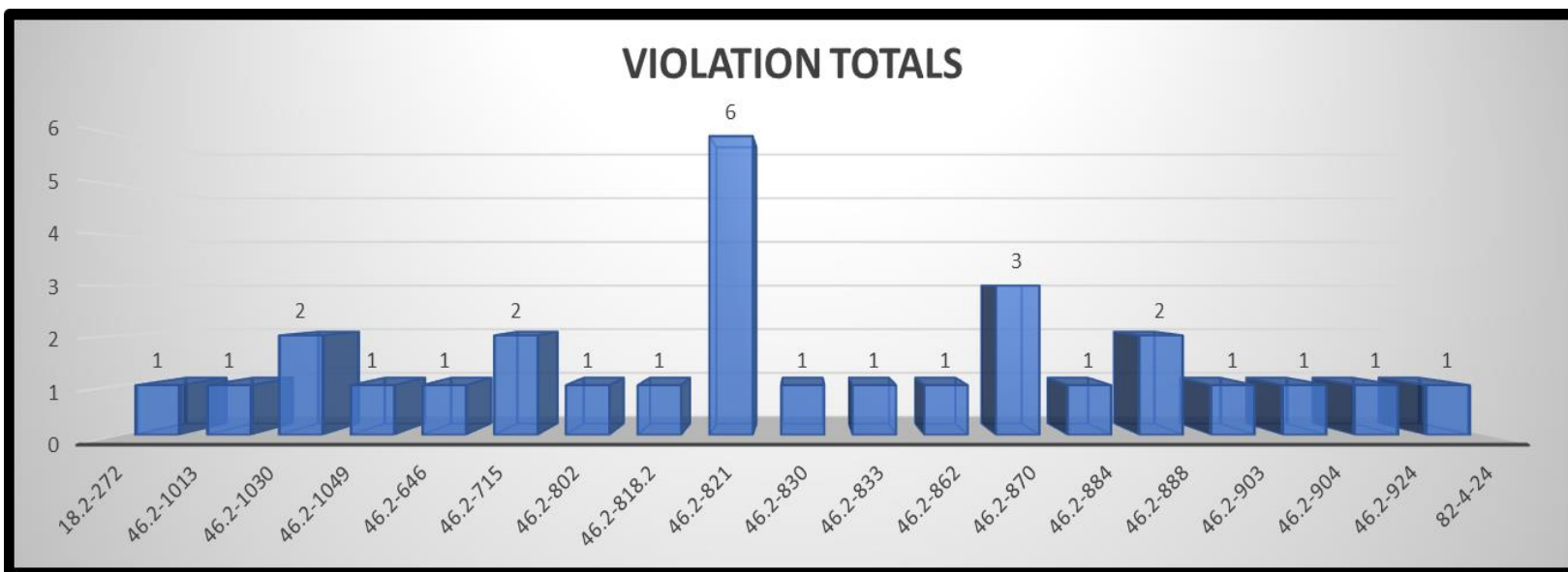
