Timely Warning Notification - Motor Vehicle Thefts (Electric Scooters) on Fairfax Campus

To the George Mason University Community,

Mason has experienced several incidents of electric scooter thefts on the Fairfax campus in recent days:

- Tuesday, July 8, 2025, between 3:00 PM 4:30 PM, outside of Peterson Hall (Case # 25-009275)
- Monday, July 7, 2025, between 10:00 AM 2:00 PM, outside of Exploratory Hall (Case # 25-009217)
- Saturday, July 5, 2025, between 12:50 PM 2:40 PM, outside of Aquatic and Fitness Center (Case # 25-009137)
- Wednesday, July 2, 2025, between 6:20 PM 9:00 PM, outside of Merten Hall (Case # 25-009068)

Although the electric scooters are secured to bike racks, suspects have been able to bypass locks and steal the electric scooters. Riders are encouraged to:

- Register Scooters and Bicycles online at https://transportation.gmu.edu/transportation-services/bicycle-programs/ to receive a **free** U-lock
- Utilize high-quality U-locks to secure electric scooters and bicycles to bike racks
- Install tracking devices, such as Air Tags, when possible
- Report all crimes and suspicious persons or incidents to Mason Police immediately at (703) 993-2810
